EBSCO UI changes

Anne: Some problems with UI and not expecting where things moved. Biggest issue with logins and not being able to stay logged in - have gone back to classic UI until EBSCO figures out their login issue. Too many features have been combined.

Liz: Haven't switched yet, but digging into it. It's confusing and some basic things are gone. Noticed that there was supposed to be a Third Iron integration – was a webinar and a very involved process.

Mini: frustration with not being able to batch delete articles from folder.

Loren: got frantic call from faculty member as soon as it switched. Had a grad class and looked at tutorials from EBSCO website.

Jon: issue with ILS or institutional repositories and cataloging/metadata – if we use them are we "outing" people's research?

Qualtrics survey on executive orders and perspectives of librarians on the impacts.

<u>Metadata Justice in Oklahoma Libraries & Archives Symposium</u> – plus three years of proceedings.

Loren: DEI office at Carroll changed to office of community culture a few years ago

Dora: At ProHealth Care, she was chair of DEI committee, and the entire program was disbanded after the election. But CME requires some DEI education for accreditation.

Jon: if academic health centers can't make the case for DEI and its impact on healthcare, then who will? <u>ACGME DEI page</u>
